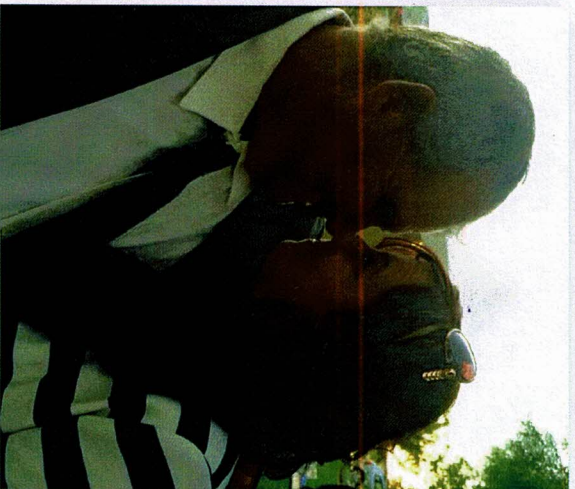


The Farewell.
